D. (G). Traffic Impact Study submitted to State for SR 310

President Burkholder said he is concerned that Etna Township is being excluded from the planning process and would like to hire an independent engineering firm to develop a plan that would look out for the township's best interests. The placement of a "big box" retailer on SR 310 will be a major disaster because the roadway can not handle the traffic that will be generated.

Mr. George said he agreed with Burkholder but was opposed to spending taxpayers money for an independent plan that ODOT will not adhere to.

President Burkholder said that ODOT has public hearings for public input and recommendations and is receptive to suggestions.
