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Etna Township Street Tree Policy

WHEREAS, the Etna Township Board of Trustees acknowledges that street trees can provide certain economic, social, environmental, ecological, and aesthetic benefits to the community, and,

WHEREAS, the Etna Township Board of Trustees recognizes that these street trees must be appropriately planned, planted, and maintained in order to maximize the benefits of the trees to both the individual homeowners and the entire community, and

WHEREAS, the Etna Township Board of Trustees seeks to advance the public health, safety, and general welfare;

WHEREAS, the Etna Township Board of Trustees has the authority under Ohio Revised Code Section 5529.11 to administer a policy regarding street trees;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following policy shall govern the planting and use of street trees within Etna Township:

A. Definition

1. Street Tree: Any tree planted, from this date forward, within a township right-of-way.
2. Tree Lawn: The space between the street edge or edge of the curb and a sidewalk or ditch.

B. Administration

1. A Road Right-of-Way Permit must be approved by the Etna Township Road Superintendent prior to the planting of any Street Tree. Said permit and any necessary inspections will serve to ensure that this policy has been upheld. Additionally, the \$50 fee for the Right-of-Way Permit will be charged for the administration of the permit and any necessary inspections by the Road Superintendent.

C. Location

1. Street Trees shall not be planted in the right-of-way where there is not a minimum of 7 feet between the edge of the street pavement/curb and the sidewalk.
2. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 10 feet from any ditch or underground yard tile.
3. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 20 feet to a residential driveway.
4. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 15 feet to a fire hydrant.
5. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 25 feet to an overhead utility pole or overhead utility line.
6. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 5 feet from the edge of street pavement or the back edge of the curb.
7. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 3 feet from the front edge of any sidewalk.

8. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 40 feet from another street tree.
9. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 6 feet from any underground utility tap or utility line.
10. Street Trees shall not be planted closer than 6 feet from any crosswalk or sidewalk ramp.
11. Street Trees shall conform to the clear sight triangle regulations listed in Section 1607 (Clear Sight Distance at Street & Access Drive Intersections) of the Etna Township Zoning Resolution.
12. The center of the tree trunk of a street tree, at the time of planting, shall be used for the purposes of measuring the location of street trees.

D. Maintenance

1. The primary responsibility for care and maintenance of Street Trees in the right-of-way is upon the private property owners. In situations where the right-of-way has been platted, the adjacent private property owner, not the owner of the right-of-way, shall be held primarily responsible.
2. Said owners of property on which a Street Tree is located will be required to prune or cause to be pruned such trees in a manner that the trees will not obstruct or shade street lights, obstruct the passage of pedestrians on sidewalks, obstruct vision of traffic signs, obstruct view of any street intersection or generally obstruct vehicular traffic.
3. The township shall have the right to plant, prune, maintain and remove trees, plants and shrubs within any township right-of-way as may be necessary to insure public safety or to preserve or enhance the symmetry and beauty of such public grounds. The Township Road Superintendent or Board of Trustees, or a designee, may remove or cause to be removed, any tree or part thereof which is in an unsafe condition, is injurious to, or obstructing any public infrastructure improvements, is affected with any injurious fungus, insect or other pest, or is considered to be a nuisance.

E. Acceptable Tree Species

1. Prohibited Trees: The following list of trees are specifically prohibited from being used as street trees within any township right-of-way:
