The Etna Township Board of Trustees met on April 5, 2005 in the Etna Township Hall to hold a regular meeting. The meeting was called to order at 7:04 p.m. by President Burkholder and the pledge of allegiance was recited.

Roll call showed Mrs. Siddens, Mr. George, President Burkholder and the clerk present.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Mr. George moved to adopt the agenda. Siddens seconded.

Mr. George moved to amend the agenda to move payment of the bills after correspondence. Siddens seconded.

Roll Call on amendment: Siddens, yes; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES

Mr. George moved to approve the March 1, 2005 meeting minutes. Burkholder seconded. Roll Call: Siddens, yes; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

Mrs. Siddens moved to approve the March 15, 2005 meeting minutes. Burkholder seconded Roll Call: Siddens, yes; George, abstain; Burkholder, yes.

President Burkholder moved to approve the March 29, 2005 special meeting minutes. Siddens seconded.

Roll Call: Siddens, yes; George, abstain; Burkholder, yes.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Richard Lord introduced Rhonda Loomis, office manager for the Southwest Licking Community Water and Sewer District (SWLCWSD). Ms Loomis was hired to improve customer service and spoke about the new Geographical Information Systems (GIS). Intent is to share data of GIS with connecting entities.

Marta Murphy, 8736 National Road, said her property, adjacent to Longwood Crossing, has access to Route 40, is for sale and would solve the problem of the emergency access to Route 40 for the developer. The Murphys' will not give the developer a right-of-way across the front of their yard which would decrease their property value. The house and 1.49 acres is for sale.

Steve Holloway, Chairman of the BZA, displayed his proposed sign to be placed at locations that are before the board for a variance consideration. Quotes were given.

Richard Lord, Representative for the SWLCWSD, gave his report at this time. He is working with the Van Dyne's on storm water runoff and the district is looking into stopping the annexation of 123.5 acres at Refugee and Summit Road by Reynoldsburg. The district purchased property on Mink Street for a million gallon water tower. Mrs. Siddens spoke about an additional hydrant on Laurel Drive in Jardin Manor and said the number of hydrants in Longwood Crossing should be checked since the fire requirements have changed since the development was approved.

Jim Van Dyne, 7173 Refugee Road, said when the sewer line was constructed through Frontier Ranch, from Watkins to York Road, dirt piles were left behind which could cause a flooding problem for his property.

Dee Dunlop, 970 Columbus Street, expressed concerns on the closing of Columbus Street at Route 310 and the widening of Route 310. Her nail salon may not exist after the widening and she does not want an ugly guardrail closing Columbus Street but would like to see an aesthetic treatment to match the park.

Grant Snider also expressed concerns on the closing of Columbus Street.

OLD BUSINESS

A. Motion to retain Loveland & Brosius for legal services for Taylor Road project Resolution 05-04-05-01: President Burkholder moved to retain the law firm of Loveland & Brosius for the Taylor Road project not to exceed \$10,000. George seconded. Roll Call: Siddens, no; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

B. Purchase orders requested by the road crew

Resolution 05-04-05-02: Mrs. Siddens moved to purchase two strobe lights and master switches from Ace Truck Equipment, not to exceed \$100. Burkholder seconded.

Roll Call: Siddens, yes; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

C. Location of severe weather siren

Mr. George said he would like to place the siren on the northeast corn of the township garage. A 60' pole will be installed 10' into the ground and the siren will be 50' above ground, the

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maximum height for the siren to perform efficiently.

Mrs. Siddens expressed concerns about the placement of the siren, operating at 127 decibels, at the garage. She felt the magnification could be detrimental to the surrounding neighborhood. She would like to review the CBG-171 document for the federal regulations and for Ralph Anderson from BAC Communications to give his approval of the placement.

President Burkholder moved to table this item. George seconded. Roll Call: Siddens, yes; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

D. Estimates for road department.

President Burkholder moved to table this item. George seconded.

E. Cameron Chase subdivision final plat and subdivision deficiencies.

Correspondence was received fro M/I Homes that they may pursue legal action. President Burkholder said he attended the LCPC meeting and there are still about 15 outstanding items that have not been addressed in the earlier phase of the subdivision. According to the DLZ Engineering report, only two or three items on the punch list were corrected.. Jerry Brems, LCPC director, said he would not sign off on the final plat until all items were addressed.

G. Cumberland Trail, approval of letters regarding green space Several prepared letters were received from Craig Paynter regarding building on the driving range which is part of the green space. One letter is to Mr. Whalen with MAS Cumberland and one to the statutory agent for Columbia Road, LTD.

Resolution 05-04-05-03: President Burkholder moved to approve the letters as presented, except to change the name of the signer from President Burkholder to Craig Paynter, and to send a copy to Ethel Runkle Cochran, the Licking County Prosecutor and LCPC. George seconded.

Discussion: Mrs. Siddens objected saying she just received copies of the letters tonight and did not have time to review them.

Roll Call: Siddens, abstain; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

H. Longwood Crossing, discussion of amendment process

President Burkholder and Mr. George said the requested amendment needs to go through the whole process of the zoning commission, LCPC and come before the trustees. Mrs. Siddens said the amendment should be heard by the BZA to protect the township if the decision is litigated.

Resolution 05-04-05-04: Mr. George moved to send a letter to Connie Klema that the amendment request for the emergency access road should start with the zoning commission and for the request to go to LCPC and for the trustees to have the final vote. Burkholder seconded. Roll Call: Siddens, no; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

Mike Whitehead, 9501 Lynns Road, attorney with the same law firm as Connie Klema, questioned if the fire district had independent control to review the proposed amendment or if the trustees advised the fire department not to review the plans for the emergency access.

Mr. George said Ms. Klema was told by the fire chief that the fire district will never approve a plan that was not first approved by the trustees.

I. Part-time Zoning Inspector Job Description & training (draft)

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President Burkholder said he would like to present some proposed amendments to the zoning resolution regarding the position of the zoning inspector.

President Burkholder moved to remove this item from the table. George seconded Roll Call: Siddens, abstain; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

The Attorney General's Office responded that they do not provide opinions to individual township officers, boards or commissions, only those directly from the county prosecutors.

Mrs. Siddens reported that due to the warmer weather, many residents were piling the debris from the winter ice storm into the township road right-of-ways. She suggested notifying residents that they could bring their debris to the township garage for disposal within a certain time limit.

President Burkholder said it was not the township's responsibility to clean up debris dumped into the right-of-way by homeowners. Violators should be prosecuted. He could support a community clean-up day where Rumpke could donate some dumpsters.

F. Brandy Mills over flow pipe

Mrs. Siddens reported that the site manager informed her the pipe was replaced.

G. Approve letter from Licking County Emergency Management regarding FEMA Resolution 05-04-05-06: Mrs. Siddens moved to appoint Barbara Digel-Barrett, clerk, as the designated agent for the Public Assistance Grant Program administered through the Ohio Emergency Management Agency. President Burkholder seconded the motion.

H. Reynoldsburg annexations

President Burkholder said Reynoldsburg City Council passed a resolution that they could provide services to the 123.5 acre parcel on Refugee and Summit Road.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Claudette Van Dyne, 7173 Refugee Road, said it is the property owners responsibility to clean up the storm debris not the township's responsibility. As a taxpayer of the township, she said she has a problem with paying a trustee and not being able to put creditability and trustworthiness into a trustee who would deliberately make accusations to the Ohio Attorney General about a commission board when they had no knowledge about was said or done.

Neil Ingle, 71 Trail East, said he agrees that the amendment request for Longwood Crossing should go through the entire zoning process again and a fee should be paid. He also agrees with Mrs. Van Dyne that the property owners should clean up their storm damage debris, companies can be hired to do the job if the homeowners are unable to do the work themselves.

President Burkholder said the sheriff's department should be called and a request made for the township to be patrolled for speeding in subdivisions and illegal dumping of trash.

At 10:03 p.m., President Burkholder moved to adjourn the meeting. Siddens seconded. The vote in favor was unanimous.
