The Etna Township Board of Trustees met on April 19, 2005 in the Etna Township Hall to hold a regular meeting. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Burkholder and the pledge of allegiance was recited.

Roll call showed Mrs. Siddens, Mr. George, President Burkholder and the clerk present.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Mr. George moved to adopt the April 9, 2005 special meeting minutes. Burkholder seconded. Roll Call: Siddens, abstain; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Dan Bravard, 10252 Taylor Road, said that as chairman of the zoning commission and a township resident, he was disturbed about a Pataskala Standard newspaper article on the letter to the Licking County Prosecutor and Ohio Attorney General regarding alleged actions by the zoning commission. The zoning commission was not contacted by the trustees or the newspaper reporter regarding the matter. Mr. Bravard said the zoning commission is, has and will conduct the affairs of the township ethically, morally and legally. Secondly, he thanked the trustees for getting involved in the JEDZ and offered his assistance for its passage when placed on the ballot. Third, he thanked the trustees for hiring Laura Brown, saying she has done a marvelous job. Fourth, the members of the zoning commission disagree but they can discuss, compromise and laugh and the trustees should follow this example. The township is getting bad press on their disagreements.

Neil Ingle, 71 Trail East, said the bank now owns Cumberland Trails Golf Course and the homeowners are concerned because 72 acres of the golf course was promised as the green space for the Cumberland Trail Development.

President Burkholder said correspondence was sent to MAS Cumber and and Columbia Road Ltd. that the township would pursue legal action if the driving range, which is part of the green space were to be developed.

Mr. George said this was a bad PUD because the green space is not useable to all residents, one must be a member of the golf course to use the green space.

Jim Van Dyne, 7173 Refugee Road, said gravel has not been placed in the detention/retention ponds in Brandy Mills and would like for the zoning inspector to check on this matter. Also huge piles of dirt left in the floodplain at Frontier Ranch for at least two years needs to be removed. It is county's responsibility since they issued the right-of-way for the entrance.

Claudette Van Dyne, 7173 Refugee Road, said the zoning inspector needs to make sure the developer is in compliance with the placement of the three detention/retention ponds in Brandy Mills especially the two abutting Jardin Manor.

President Burkholder said that because of a group effort by the township trustees, residents and commissions, the county engineer's office will be hiring independent inspectors to check subdivisions.

Tom Dixon, 8467 Hazelton-Etna Road, inquired if the zoning inspector could follow up with the county on the cut tile which was not on the punch list. This cut tile is causing flooding on his property.

Regarding the annexation, President Burkholder said according to ORC 709.023 and 503.7, the property will remain part of Etna Township's tax base. A few Reynoldsburg officials continually bring up the fact that Etna continues to receive tax money from the annexed properties. Burkholder said that Reynoldsburg receives the income tax money from the residents and businesses and if they do not like this, then they should not accept the annexation. A healthy township is in Reynoldsburg's best interest as well as a healthy Reynoldsburg is in the best interest of the township.

OLD BUSINESS

A. Location of severe weather siren

Mr. George reported that Ralph Anderson with B&C Communications assured him that the southeast corner of the township garage was an ideal location to install the tornado siren and there is no danger of dbd's from that point and no harm to anyone in the area. Only 123 dbd's are emitted first and then drops to 115 at 100' and the nearest house is about 200' away. KMA Electric can take a 20 amp circuit from the electric panel in the garage and run a conduit to the pole and siren.

Resolution 05-04-19-01: Mr. George moved to contract with KMA Electric to install the tornado siren on the southeast corner of the township garage. Burkholder seconded. Roll Call: Siddens, no; George, yes; Burkholder, yes.
