PRESENTATION

Greg Chamblin with PC Geeks went through his proposal and explained the backup procedure he recommends. The proposal is for 3 external hard drives, consulting fees, training of staff and documenting backup procedures and 2 additional battery backup units.

Resolution 07-05-01-01: Mr. Burkholder moved to approve the contract with PC Geeks for \$800 for their proposal. Knapp seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Claudette Van Dyne, 7173 Refugee Road, said the township needs a fireproof cabinet for the storage of backups and minutes.

Rich Ruff, 7 Spike Rush Court, said he fully supports the trustees' effort on parking restrictions for his cul-de-sac.

Mr. George said that if a no parking restrictions are placed on cul-de-sacs, the names of the cul-de-sacs must be listed in the resolution. Mr. Burkholder said there needs to be a ban on parking in the entire cul-de-sac and not just at the throat.

Brandon Menniger, 138 Lincoln Street, said he submitted a resume and inquired if the township would be hiring a road worker soon. Trustees said this item would be discussed under the road report.

Claudette Van Dyne suggested that the township post "Tow Away" signs with the resolution and then contract with a towing company to enforce the no parking areas.

Road – written report submitted

Mr. George reported on an alley vacation request between Baltimore Street, north of Pike Street and the next alley to the west. Mr. Burkholder said the trustees need to make their concerns known to the county commissioners. Mr. George said he will be getting new quotes for the storm drain repair at Zeller Acres and ask Ty Yoho how this was approved by the county. The crack sealer machine needs a new hose which will cost \$649 plus freight.

Resolution 07-05-01-02: Mr. George moved to approve the expenditure of \$849 to BrewPro for a new hose. Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Mr. Burkholder asked about street cleaning for the subdivisions. Neil Ingle received a quote from the water and sewer district for water, \$4.82 per 1000 gals for a street cleaner. Mr. George said the quote from Contract Sweepers is \$1785 to clean Cumberland Trails, Brandy Mills, Longwood, Zeller Acres, Peppertree, Orchard Glen and Cameron Chase.

Mr. Burkholder moved to move forward with the street cleaning with Contract Sweepers contingent on the successful submission of proof of coverage with Workers Compensation and liability insurance. Knapp seconded.

Discussion: President Knapp inquired about additional bids.

Mr. Burkholder moved to table this item until the next meeting. George seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Mr. Burkholder discussed the April 24th letter from Brad Mercer concerning the Columbia Road right-of-ways. The township and LCPC missed the requirement of the right-of-way for the apartments and retail center. Burkholder said there needs to be a complete review of the limitation text of the PUD. The sidewalks, drainage and right-of-way for the Columbia Road Retail Center are inadequate. The apartments are built too close to the roadway.

Mr. Burkholder moved to put a packet together of materials and cover letter to send to the county commissioners to underscore the seriousness of this issue and to document the township's concerns. George seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Trustees discussed hiring a seasonal worker for the road department. Mr. Waller will be off for at least a week for surgery and will not be able to assume full duties for a period when he returns and the workload in this department has increased.

Zoning – written report submitted

Stan Robinson said that when the Cumberland Trail Limitation text was passed around 1999, the goal was to have a 100' right-of-way from National Road to Refugee Road. Everyone in the PUD jurisdiction was to donate roadway so there would be 50' on their side. This requirement was not enforced and zoning permits and occupancy permits were issued. Those needing to comply are: MAS Cumberland, Trail Golf LTD, Dominion Homes (Cumberland Crossing), Cumberland Highland (apartments), Metro-Six and properties at 29 and 39 Sedge Court and 25 Trail Blvd. Metro-Six is willing to donate 20' to the road right-of-way but is asking for reimbursement of engineer costs, about a \$1000.

Mr. Burkholder questioned how the BZA chairman could cancel a hearing that was scheduled and advertised. There are no minutes from the meeting and there was no vote by the Board in open session to cancel the meeting. Mr. Robinson said the decision was based on a legal opinion from the prosecutor. Burkholder requested a copy of the legal opinion and a copy of the letter sent by Mr. Goll to the prosecutor. Mrs. Brown said that Mr. Goll's request was verbal.

Mr. George questioned why the attorney with Chester, Wilcox & Saxbe told Stan Robinson he did not have the authority to represent Stan at the BZA hearing. Mr. Burkholder said Stan needed Board approval and approval of funds. President Knapp said a resolution was passed for legal expenses for the
