The Etna Township Board of Trustees met on October 16, 2007 at the Etna Township Hall to hold a regular meeting. President Knapp called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. with a moment for silent prayer and the pledge of allegiance was recited. Roll call showed President Knapp, Trustee Burkholder, Trustee George and Fiscal Officer Digel-Barrett present.

The motion to adopt the agenda was made by Mr. George, seconded by Burkholder and the vote in favor was unanimous.

ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES

Mr. George moved to approve the September 28, 2007 special meeting minutes. Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Mr. George moved to approve the October 2, 2007 meeting minutes. Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments

PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. 9361 Watkins Road and 7913 National Road rezoning submitted by the zoning commission At 7:04 p.m., Mr. George moved to come out of recess for the public hearing, Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

The zoning commission requests: 1) the property at 7913 National Road be rezoned from Residential (R1) and Agricultural (AG) to Manufactured Home Park (MHP) and 2) the property at 9361 Watkins Road be rezoned from MHP, R1 and AG to RI to correct the existing map which has been in error for some time. The original maps were hand drawn and not well maintained.

Mr. George said the map should be corrected because the mobile home park has been there for many years.

Beverley Plants, 9608 Watkins Road, asked about the process should it go thru the zoning commission

Bernie Caplin said the Brogans do not object to correcting the map if there was an error but they do object to the rezoning of their property if there is no mistake on the zoning. There is no proof one way or the other. The Brogans do not have plans at this time to develop the property.

President Knapp said they could not find where the property on Watkins Road was rezoned to MPH.

Mr. George said he can not understand why a small section of the property would be zoned MPH when the existing mobile home park is on the other side of the property line.

Mr. Caplin said property should not be rezoned without proper notification to the property owners and with their consent. He would not object if the trustees sustain the zoning commission's request if the trustees believe it is a correction. Mr. Caplin said he was here to fight the rezoning without the Brogans knowledge and permission. Mr. Caplin said they would not file any lawsuits.

At 7:40 p.m., Mr. George moved to close the public hearing, Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Resolution 07-10-16-02: President Knapp moved to approve the rezoning of the Low Density Residential (R1) and Agricultural (AG) on 7913 National Road to Manufactured Home Park (MHP). George seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Resolution 07-10-16-03: Mr. George moved to accept the recommendation of the zoning commission to rezone the property at 9361 Watkins Road to R-1. Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Mr. Burkholder said he wanted the record to reflect that he agreed with Mr. Caplin and that mistakes were made and noted about the notification process.

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B. Text amendment on Article 16 – Buffering, Section 913, Section 914 and definitions At 7:45 p.m., Mr. George moved to come out of recess for the public hearing, Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

President Knapp said the requested legal opinion came this afternoon. The trustees need more time to review the recommendations and suggested another recess for this hearing.

At 7:50 p.m., Mr. Burkholder moved to recess the public hearing until the November 8th meeting at 7:15 p.m. George seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Mr. George reported on the problems with the detention pond and roads in Watkins Grove. Mr. Burkholder said it appeared the base of the road is defective.

Resolution 07-10-16-04: Mr. George moved to approve the expenditure of \$3960 to BrewPro for 9000 lbs of crack sealing material. Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous

Resolution 07-10-16-05: Mr. Burkholder moved to approve the expenditure of \$500 to Kleem for road signs. George seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

Mr. George said numerous trees need to be removed on Refugee Road west of Mink Street and would like to rent a chipper for \$3382.

President Knapp said he learned that Pataskala has a chipper and is interested in renting a crack sealer, which Etna has, and that maybe the two entities could work out some arrangement. Mr. Burkholder talked about meeting with Pataskala on the repaving of Refugee Road and addressing some of the drainage issues.

President Knapp moved to explore the possibility of sharing equipment with Pataskala and to request the county prosecutor to draft a contract and agreement. George seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous

Resolution 07-10-16-06: Mr. George moved to approve the expenditure of \$1465 to Redskin for 100 tons of #411gravel. Burkholder seconded and the vote in favor was unanimous.

The trustees discussed the problem of parking in cul-de-sacs and also parking on the street. The trustees received an opinion from the prosecutor and need to choose the areas to enforce the "no parking" and the prosecutor will draft a resolution for those areas. The prosecutor advised that the "no parking" be adopted only for the problem areas instead of a blanket "no parking" for the entire township. Signs would need to be posted. Burkholder suggested that a tentative list of the problem areas be drafted based on complaints
