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The Etna Township Board of Trustees met on Tuesday May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2011 in the Etna Township Community Center/Administration Building for the purpose of conducting a special meeting. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Vice-President Foor. Jeff Johnson led the invocation and Randy Foor led the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call showed Trustees Jeff Johnson, Randy Foor, John Carlisle and Fiscal Officer Walter Rogers present.

Trustee Carlisle moved to adopt the agenda. The motion was seconded by Trustee Johnson and passed by unanimous affirmative vote.

### **Nuisance and Junk Motor Vehicle Hearings**

#### **1028 Pike Street (Nuisance)**

Chris Harkness presented an overview of the violation. This property has previous violations and a hearing was heard in 2010. The property owner was not present. Chris Harkness inspected the property on April 6<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>, and 28<sup>th</sup>, 2011; and May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2011. The Licking County Health Department and Licking County Building Codes have also inspected the property.

Lisa Loudenslager of 1010 Pike Street lives next door to this property. She discussed the motor homes, the boat, the hole in the foundation of the house, and the stove pipe resting on a refrigerator. Lisa Loudenslager stated the property owner is also parking his vehicles on the other properties in the area.

Chris Harkness stated a year ago both the motor homes were operable and Mr. Howard was able to move them. Chris Harkness explained the process. The Trustees discussed passing a resolution for Chris Harkness to have the authorization to pursue the nuisance without holding monthly meetings.

Brice Johnson of 1010 Pike Street recommended calling Law Director Richard Pfeiffer who was an environmental judge in Franklin County for information.

This item was table until the 7:00 p.m. meeting for further discussion with Eric Fox of the Licking County Prosecutor's Office.


#### **9764 Tollgate Road (Junk Motor Vehicles)**
