Trustee Carlisle discussed an outstanding invoice from B&C Communications for \$170.00 for repairs to the siren. Trustee Foor explained the issue with this invoice and he will handle it. Trustee Foor moved to go into executive session at 8:21 p.m. per O.R.C. 121.22 (G) (1) to consider the compensation of a public employee or official. The motion was seconded by Trustee Carlisle and passed by unanimous affirmative vote. Trustee Carlisle moved to come out of executive session at 9:21 p.m. The motion was seconded by Trustee Foor and passed by unanimous vote. Trustee Carlisle stated F/O Rogers withheld the overtime that was on the timesheets and he feels, along with the Prosecutor's opinion, that he had the statutory authority to do as he did as the Fiscal Officer. Trustee Carlisle does not have an issue paying the employees the overtime but has an issue with the timesheets. Mr. LaRosa requested the time sheets and requested Walter Rogers review January the 15th, the holiday of Martin Luther King Day. They were called into plow; they received the 8 hours of holiday pay and 10 hours of double time for the same date. The policy in the manual, 7.2.1, shall receive 2 times their regular pay. On December 24th, Christmas Eve which was a Sunday, they were called into salt and should receive time and a half not double time. This needs to be adjusted for all three of employees. The Trustees would like a copy of the calculations after the adjustments are made. F/O Rogers stated the biggest part of the time he was questioning was the seventeen hours the three of them were in the truck which is a violation of the twelve hour rule. Trustee Carlisle is scheduling a Special Meeting for March the 14th at 6:00 p.m., mandatory that all employees attend this meeting including Mr. Singleton.
